I find this to be pretty interesting. If it works, think of how much money we'd be willing to pay for this procedure? I remember as a kid I watched a move called "Tuck Everlasting." The movie was about a family that drank water from a tree that made them immortal. Whatever they did, they could not die. One thing interesting about the movie is that this family's immortality was more of a cursing than a blessing. Think about it: living forever in a sin-sick filled world with the wickedness and suffering of man isn't really the kind of eternal life to be admired. Without God, once you accomplish all your goals, obtain all your riches, fulfill all your pleasures, what's left to keep you satisfied?

While I'm not saying that living long is bad, as Christians we need to remember that Hebrews 9:27 says, "And just as it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment." Medical discoveries that prolong life are great. But that does not mean they can keep us alive forever. In the days before the flood, people in Scripture lived for hundreds of years. Even if we surpassed the age of Methuselah who lived for 969 years (Genesis 5:27), that is but a passing moment compared to eternity.

Regardless of how long we live on this earth, for God's children, this world is not our home (John 14:1-4). This world will one day perish (2 Peter 3:10), and our ultimate desire is for the eternal life that awaits us, not the one here on earth (Colossians 3:1-4).
