

4 Reasons to Believe in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ

Deny Him or follow Him, despise Him or love Him, something one cannot deny is that around 2,000 years ago ancient historians such as Cornelius Tacitus, Flavius Josephus, and Lucian Samosata all make mention of an actual man from Galilee named Jesus. The Bible reveals He was more than just a man. He was God in human flesh (John 1:1-14). How can we know this? His resurrection from the dead. Consider 4 brief reasons to believe in the resurrection:

- 1. The fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy: Hundreds of years before the birth of Christ, David wrote, "For you will not leave my soul in Sheol, Nor will You allow Your Holy One to see corruption" (Psalm 16:10). The apostle Peter reveals that David did not write this about himself since his body did decay and his remains are still in his tomb (Acts 2:27-31).
- **2.** The first-century argument from His enemies: If anyone's greatest nightmare came true when Jesus rose from the dead, it was the Jewish leaders who had Him killed. The best reason they gave in dismissing the resurrection after paying off the soldiers assigned to guarding the tomb was the disciples stole to body while ALL of them were sleeping (**Matthew 28:11-15**). So, not only did a band of well-trained Roman soldiers fall asleep on the job, they also did not wake up when a very large stone was rolled away to steal Jesus' body; and they also knew who stole Jesus' body while they were asleep? This story does not add up.
- 3. Investigating more modern explanations only makes the case for the resurrection stronger: Numerous theories have sought to explain away the resurrection. For instance, some have said that Jesus never died but pretended to be dead. To believe that anyone could survive being beaten by the Jewish authorities, scourged, crucified, speared in the side and pronounced dead by Roman executioners; and then survive Friday night to Sunday morning in a tomb is just as miraculous as the resurrection. To say that the disciples went to the wrong tomb Sunday morning, even though they were just there Friday evening, is also a foolish thing to believe given that they would have had a difficult time not noticing the Roman soldiers guarding the tomb; which would also have prompted the Jewish authorities to clarify this mistake by showing the correct tomb and His actual body. To believe that the disciples hallucinated when they saw Jesus come back from the dead is also unreasonable since two people, let alone many more, don't hallucinate at the same

time and have the same exact hallucinations on multiple occasions.

4. The Credibility of the eye witnesses: When we harmonize the gospel accounts of the resurrection in observing no contradictions, while having more than a sufficient number of eye witnesses (over 500, see 1 Corinthians 15:1-8). In addition, when we observe specifically the apostles who cowardly fled for their lives after Jesus was arrested (Mark 15:50), but 50 days later stood on the day of Pentecost preaching that Jesus rose from the dead (Acts 2:1-38), then later went on devoting the rest of their lives in spreading this message, enduring imprisonment, beatings, and many other types of hardships to the point of being killed for something they fabricated or knew to be a lie is not a logical explanation for the drastic change in their lives. In fact, when we consider that the resurrection message was not done for money, fame, pleasure or any other ulterior motive from these men, the only reasonable explanation is that they were telling the truth. Jesus really did rise from the dead!
