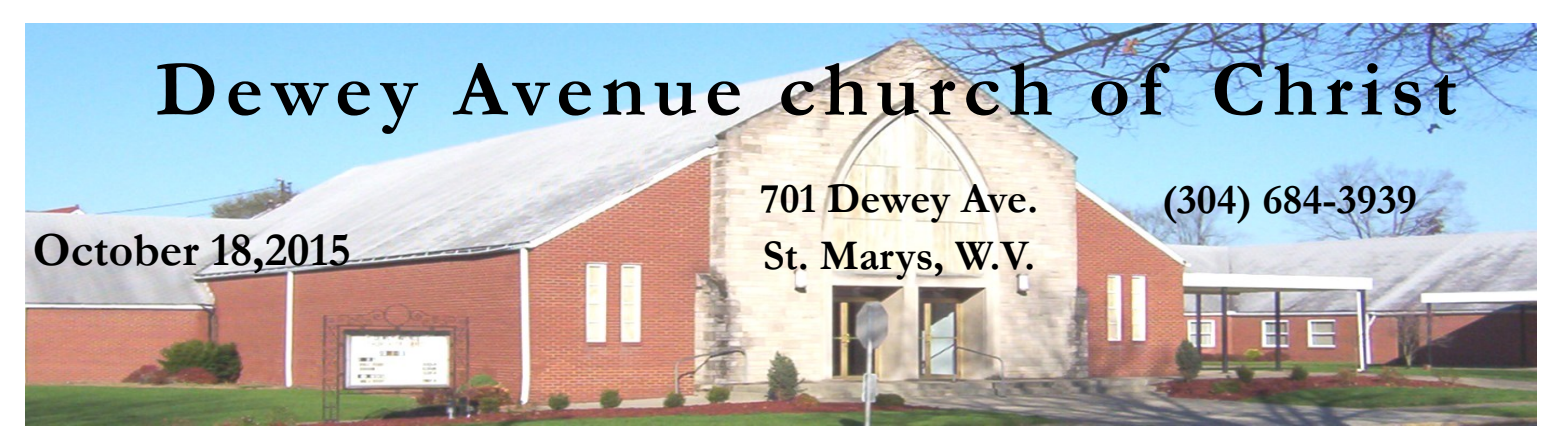

Jesus is all the World to Me

In the early 20th century, Hymn writer Will L. Thompson (1847-1909) penned the lyrics, “Jesus is all the world to me, my life, my joy, my all; he is my strength from day to day, without him I would fall. When I am said to him I go, no other one can cheer me so; when I am sad, he makes me glad, he’s my friend.”

How much did Jesus mean to people in Scripture? Christ meant all the world to the man whose life was restored to normal when possessed with many demons (Mark 5:1-20). To the men who were terminally ill with leprosy, Jesus was the greatest person they’d ever met (Luke 17:12-19). Jesus meant everything to the official whose son was ill to the point of death (John 4:43-52). He was arguably the life saver of the woman brought to Him caught in the act of adultery (John 8:1-8). He was the life changer to the woman who was known as a sinner when forgiven of her sins (Luke 7:36-50).

What does Jesus mean to us today? Herbert C. Gabhart observed, “To artists, He is the One altogether lovely. To architects, He is the Chief Cornerstone. To physicians, He is the Great Physician. To preachers, He is the Word of God. To philosophers, He is the Wisdom of God. To the dying, He is the Resurrection and the Life. To geologists, He is the Rock of ages. To farmers, He is the Lord of the harvest. To professors, He is the Master Teacher. To prodigals, He is the forgiving Father. To the lost sheep, he is the Good Shepherd. To thirsty souls, He is the Water of life. To the hungry, He is the Bread of life. To philanthropists, He is God’s Unspeakable Gift.” (Calvin Miller, The Book Of Jesus, p. 41)

With the peace of God we can have in this life (Philippians 4:7), as well as the assurance that He is in control and still reigns in our world (Matthew 28:18), in harmony with the desire and expectation of eternal life when this one comes to an end, Jesus is all the world to us!
