FAITH VS. ATOMIC BOMBS:
(1949)

You have heard how powerful the atomic bomb is. The first one blasted Hiroshima flat, and killed about 75,000 people in a flash. Today, three and a half years later, the Hiroshima bomb is already out of date: a new variety is said to be one hundred times more effective. Yet his mighty instrument of destructions' core of fissionable material is said to be no larger than golf ball. All mankind tremble at the thought of this tiny destroyer of cities, this potential destroyer of worlds and civilizations.

Yet we know that something infinitely smaller and illimitably more powerful. It is called Faith. We are told that a grain of faith no larger than a mustard seed can move mountains. The atomic bomb may scar [e] them, but it cannot move them.

Our scientists tell us that there is no defense against the atomic bomb... but their eyes are covered with scales and they cannot see the bright promises of faith.

There is a force in men's lives a million times more powerful, for good, than the bomb is powerful for evil. That is the force of men's faith in God. That is the love of God for the souls of men. The carpenter's humble son stood on the shores of Galilee and spake as man never spoke before or since. Only a few heard or heeded Him then, yet what HE said has exercised a more powerful influence on the lives of men than all the philosophers, scientists, seers and prophets put together. The United States is the citadel and arsenal of democracy. It is the only great nation founded on religious principles. It is the only nation with the material strength and the spiritual resources to lead the world out of its materialistic wilderness.

Why not use the enormous reservoir of spiritual power to solve our apparently insurmountable difficulties? It is there, waiting, it is there, asking to be invoked. It is there, free for the taking.

A religious revival, sweeping this country and spreading out into all the world, would do more than all the statesmen, diplomats and generals who have lived since time began to save our civilization and avert the threat of atomic chaos.
