Conflict and chaos is something we either directly or indirectly experience on a regular basis. Whether it be people complaining, threatening or criticizing on social media; or all the problems we watch daily on the local news. The relational issues people have at work, as well as the arguments and problems between husbands and wives, parents and children. Even things that are designed to be entertaining such as reality TV or sports, can have the worst of conflicts when tempers flare among fans, players and parents.

Everyone responds to conflict differently. From being completely avoidant to being verbally abusive or violent. While some seek peaceful solutions, others are only concerned with vengeance and dominance. Some admit when wrong, others are only focused on the wrongs of another.

The apostle wrote in Colossians 3:14-15, "And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. (15) And let the peace of Christ rule in your heats, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful." Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, even in crazy, trying times? Yes. The word "rule" in verse 15, was "used to describe the umpire or referee who moderated and judged the athletic competitions that were so popular in the ancient world." (Renner 2) As one writer notes, "When detrimental emotions attempt to exert control over us or try to throw us into an emotional frenzy, we can stop it from happening by making the choice to let God's peace rise up from deep inside us like an umpire or referee to moderate our emotions. As we do, we will be kept under the control of that divine peace as it rules in our hearts. When this divine umpire called 'peace' steps into the game, it suddenly begins to call the shots and make all the decisions instead of fretfulness, anxiety and worry." (2)

How is this possible? Remember,

- 1. God is in control. In the end, He wins and all who follow Him (Philippians 2:9-11).
- 2. Crazy, chaotic events can serve a purpose (Romans 8:28). At the very least they can refine us, complete us and force us to grow closer to God, clinging to His wisdom (James 1:2-7).
- 3. One is not responsible for the actions of another, but for self (Romans 12:18)
- 4. Even the very worst that man can forcibly do to us results in our eternal gain (Philippians 1:19-21).
- 5. One day God will deal with the impenitent who have committed horrible injustices in this life (Romans 12:19-21; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9).

"Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. (2) In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told that I go to prepare a place for you? (3) And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:1-3).
